VK3HY Serial numbers 103 to 109 are digital (MSK144) meteor scatter contacts. They have been logged as SSB (PH) contacts because VKCL would not accept the reports as digital. For each of these QSOs I have recorded under 'Exch Sent'the digital report sent followed by a serial number (03100 etc). Under'Exch Rcvd' I have logged 59 followed by the digital MSK144 report received from the other station.... 59 was necessary for VKCL to accept the contacts). To comply with the published rules, I have entered Maidenhead Grid Locators together with MSK144 reports sent and received. As the duration of meteor scatter QSOs vary considerably, I have entered the time that each digital QSO was completed.
